Understanding File Formats Only in the digital age do we have the ability to store and view images in a multitude of formats. To be able to store your images digitally, you need to know the basic steps required to convert them into the different file formats found on your hard drive and the Web. Most people start out by using the default format — JPG, which has an .jpg extension. But there are other file formats you may want to use, including TIFF, GIF, and Photoshop.psd, which is a raw file format. Organizing Digital Files This section covers the basics of organizing your digital files. It doesn't cover the technical aspects of organizing your files because there are plenty of books, Web sites, and online programs that can help you with such topics. Storing images in folders Organizing your files by placing them in folders is the most basic means of organizing your digital information. Even before you start taking photographs, you've got images on your computer, and you need to find them. The easiest way to find and navigate your files is to use folders. The standard rule is that you should keep your digital files inside folders so that you can find them easily. (The exception is when you want to share the information with a wide audience. You'll do that by putting your files on a Web server and using FTP or other more secure means, such as a service like Flickr, that usually have access controls for who can see your photos.) In terms of size, most images are stored in large folders. Each folder, in turn, has several sub-folders for storing smaller images, such as images you've taken with your camera, people's names, or the year. To get started, your biggest requirement is a computer with a hard drive capable of holding all the digital images you want to store. You also need to have a place to store all your photos. The next two sections take you through the steps to set up a folder hierarchy for storing all your photos. When you store your photos, make sure that the folder name includes the date and time you store the photo. This is a best practice and not strictly necessary, but it's in the spirit of keeping things organized. 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Pixel Grid allows you to define your work area in pixels. This can be useful when working on a non-square image. Lasso tools are used for selecting rectangular or elliptical areas in an image, either for cropping out the subject or for applying some special effect. The Magnetic Lasso tool requires a little extra explanation, but with practice you'll find it's very useful. The paint bucket and knife tools work similarly to each other. The bucket tool is used to fill an area with a color, and the knife tool is used to cut out a shape from an image. Clone Stamps are used to replicate colors or other parts of an image. The Copy Stamp provides a reference point for the artist to copy an object in another area of the image. The Paint Bucket is used for filling in an area with a color, and the Paint Brush allows you to fill in an area with a color. The Eraser tool is used for removing part of an image, while the Rubber Stamp tool is used to paste a copy of an image. The Fade tool is used for adding or removing a blur effect to an image. The Gradient tool is used for adding color to areas of an image. The Lens Blur tool is used for adding a blur effect to an image. The Lens Blur filter can be used on either a selection or a path. The Perspective Grid is used for placing images at an angle. The Selection Brush is used for making selections to isolate a specific area of the image. The Smudge tool is used for making small, random changes to an image. The Zoom tool is used for providing close-up or distant views of the areas of your image.
